Two Tablets: Ten Commands

The book of Exodus does not just tell us a riveting story, it introduces us to a personal God—*Yahweh:* the One and Only God of the Bible. You are welcome to our family study of Exodus every **Wednesday** evening, here, at **7 pm**.

In Exodus, we learn God's personal name (Exodus 3:14-15), which is "Yahweh", a form of the verb "to be" meaning, "I Am". God revealed His divine name through a burning bush where Moses also learned that *Yahweh* is very mission-minded and wants to use Moses in that mission!

From Exodus, we learn that *Yahweh* (the God of the Bible) is holy (3:5), caring (3:7-9), supportive (3:12). faithful (3:17 & 6:7), powerful (3:19), active (7:4-5), and jealous (20:23). We see *Yahweh* as a redeemer (6:6), a liberator (13:3), a fighter (14:14), a law-giver (chapter 20), and all glorious (40:34).

The first half of Exodus presents *Yahweh* as a powerful liberator. The second half reveals Him as a moral law-giver and guide. Our Wednesday evening study is currently covering the beginning of part two where God gives Moses the Ten Commandments (Exodus 20), some 3,300 years ago.

The Ten Commandments came to Moses on two tablets. The first four commandments on tablet one deal with our vertical relationship with Yahweh. Not only do the Ten Commandments put God first, the first one commands us to do the same. That timeless command is the foundation for all that follows forever.

The second tablet issues six commands concerning our horizontal relationships on earth with fellow human beings. When we put God first, all our human relationships are blessed.

Join us in our Wednesday night study as we dig into both tablets to tighten our grip on Gods will for our hearts and lives.
