

Did Jesus Fail?

In a culture that scares easy, we need Jesus' wisdom more than ever. He taught,

"Do not be worried about your life, as to what you will eat or what you will drink; nor for your body, as to what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing?" (Matthew 6:25).

The answer is, "Yes!" I love how Jesus imparted wisdom by asking crisp questions. But what could possibly be more important than food and clothing? What could possibly be scarier than the coronavirus or our current opioid crisis?

Jesus told His followers to seek first God's kingdom and His righteousness. Other things matter, but not as much. Jesus taught, "So do not worry about tomorrow; for tomorrow will care for itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own." (Matthew 6:34).

We know that Jesus cared about the hungry, the sick, and the needy. Therefore, our concern over hunger, disease, poverty, addiction, and other physical threats are legitimate and real.
